Beveridge Intermodal Precinct

Welcome to your quarterly update on the Beveridge Intermodal Precinct, where works are underway to transform the Beveridge Road site into a nationally significant logistics hub.

Stage 1 construction includes a permanent rail connection to the existing national freight network, an operating rail terminal and locally focused road upgrades delivered by National Intermodal, including works to Minton St and surrounds. Future stages, subject to planning approvals, will deliver a fully automated terminal and extensive co-located warehousing.

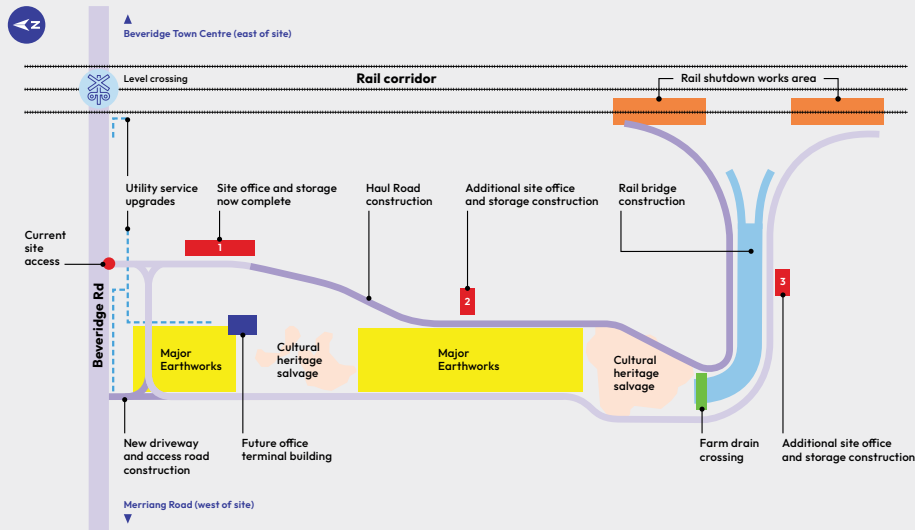
The project will strengthen Australia's freight network by improving efficiency and reducing transport costs, with the Australian Government's planned \$900 million Camerons Lane Interchange and associated infrastructure providing a critical new connection to the Hume Freeway, improving access and safety.

Some works are required to take place out of normal construction hours

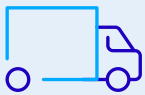


24 hours

Works Snapshot: April – June 2026

Over the next few months, you may notice an increase in activity within the project area with multiple activities taking place across the site. Key activities include:



Increased construction traffic in the area, including heavy vehicles and trucks



Major earthworks ramping up across the site to level the ground



A new driveway and construction access road will be built off Beveridge Road and along the edge of the property boundary



Work will begin on a new bridge structure spanning low-lying land at the northern end of the property, including drilling the foundations and structural works



24-hour rail works in early-May during an existing planned rail shutdown



Expansion of site offices and storage areas to support ongoing works

Upcoming Works

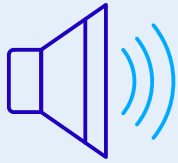
Proposed timing	Activity	Description
April – June 2026 (ongoing)	Expansion of site offices and storage areas	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Staff office now complete and project staff are now based on site full-time. Additional site offices and storage areas will be established over the next few months.
April – June 2026 (ongoing)	Indigenous cultural heritage salvage	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Salvage activities continue at designated cultural heritage locations to ensure works can proceed respectfully.
April – June 2026 (ongoing)	Major earthworks	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Earthworks will begin to level and build up the site. Excavation work will take place, including rock breaking activities commencing from June.
April – June 2026	Rail bridge construction	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Constructing foundations for a new rail bridge at the northern end of the property. This will include piling to build the foundations with a pile-driver. Preparing the area to install large bridge beams (known as Super-T Beams) later in the project.
2-5 May 2026	Planned rail shutdown	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> A planned rail corridor shutdown period will allow for completion of work safely near the train line. Works will include extending the existing rail corridor and installing a concrete pad to enable construction of the new rail bridge later this year.
April – June 2026	Farm drain crossing	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Installing new drainage pipes to provide safe access across farm drains for construction and maintenance vehicles.
May – June 2026	New driveway and access road – impacts to Beveridge Road	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> A new site access intersection and temporary construction vehicle access road will be built off Beveridge Road. The construction road will then run within the property boundary to reduce congestion on public roads and allow materials to move safely around the site. New street lights will be installed on Beveridge Road. This work may require short traffic holds at times. Nightly full closures of Beveridge Road with detours are planned for late May (pending approvals from the relevant agencies). More information will be shared closer to the relevant times.
May – June 2026	Upgrading underground services	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Service providers will upgrade various services along Beveridge Road needed for future stages of the project. Trenches will be dug along Beveridge Road to install new pipes, including a small connection near the level crossing and within the project site. Service providers will contact residents directly if their services may be affected.

Managing impacts



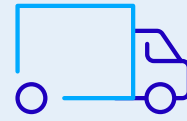
Noise and vibrations

- Low levels of noise and vibrations are expected, and measures including ongoing monitoring will be in place to manage impacts.
- Higher noise levels may occur for limited periods during foundation works or rock breaking.



Dust management

- Following best practice dust suppression measures, we will cover stockpiles of dirt with seed to minimise dust and use water carts to dampen materials, when needed



Traffic impacts

- There will be increased truck and heavy vehicle activity on Beveridge Road and nearby areas. Measures will be in place to minimise impacts, including:
 - Periods of shuttle flow traffic (one lane at a time) on Beveridge Road.
 - Signage, traffic controllers and detours. Please plan ahead and allow extra travel time.

Giving trees a second life at Beveridge Primary School

Recently, we removed some trees to prepare the Beveridge Intermodal Precinct for major construction. Rather than letting the material go to waste, the trees were mulched and donated to Beveridge Primary School.

The mulch has been used in the school's gardens to help improve soil and support outdoor spaces for students. This small initiative ensures the removed trees continue to provide value to the local community while supporting the school's outdoor learning environment.
